LETTERS FROM MMN'S BOARD CHAIR AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends and Supporters,

The 2019/2020 school year was an interesting one, but it was still a great one for our programs. During the Fall of 2019, enrollment in MMN's string programs doubled. We were able to include two new schools into our family, Ben Franklin Elementary and Paul Habans Charter. During that time, our students performed fifteen concerts at venues including the St. Louis Cathedral, live on WWL Eyewitness News, and the new Louisiana Children's Museums' Grand Opening. Before the COVID-19 shutdown, our students were invited to perform at French Quarter Fest and the Tulane Book Festival's Family Day. Even during the school shut down and move to virtual programs, the MMN staff shifted quickly to teaching Zoom lessons, creating virtual instructional videos, and building out our curriculum content. Our team produced a virtual end of year recital, program tour, and video recording of an original composition by our students. We were even able to host three virtual workshops during the month of June. In the midst of a pandemic, the murder of George Floyd, and global uprisings, our students and staff chose to focus on using music as a vehicle for self expression - reaffirming our mission as a social change program. I could not be more proud of the Make Music NOLA teachers, staff, students, and their commitment to making music. I'm looking forward to Fall 2020 and whatever new adventures it may bring! HISTORY

Make Music NOLA began in September 2011 under the name "Youth Orchestra of the Lower 9th Ward" with only 5 students. Since then, the program has expanded to eight locations, including 4 school-based programs and 4 afterschool community centers. This past fall, MMN's string programs doubled in size to reach 180 students. Our program is proudly settled in at the Bell Artspace Campus in the heart of the Treme. MMN successfully completed our second year of Saturday programs, expanding to three music theory classes.
